MISSION/PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION *

Our mission is to use robotics as a platform to strengthen our school and community by promoting STEM education, mentoring younger students, and demonstrating the power of teamwork and innovation. We aim to compete with integrity, collaborate with purpose, and inspire the next generation of creators.

Our club exists to empower students to become confident problem-solvers and leaders. Through participation in FIRST Robotics, we build robots, build skills, and build each other—creating an inclusive environment where every member has the opportunity to contribute, grow, and make an impact.

The club operates year-round, with students meeting throughout the school year. In the fall, the team meets twice a week to mentor middle school students, prepare for the upcoming robotics season, and promote their program within the community. The competitive season officially begins on January 10th, when the year's new global challenge is announced. From that moment, the team has just two and a half months to design, engineer, build, and test their robot.

During the season, they compete in two events across Michigan, working to earn enough points to qualify for the state championship in April. Combining performance at the state championship along with the qualifying competitions, the team can earn an invitation to the world competition. This intensive schedule provides students with hands-on experience in STEM, teamwork, time management, and real-world problem solving.

Of the five seniors who were involved in the program last year, all five have gone on to pursue a higher education, 3 in engineering, 1 in machining and the other in journalism. All students are welcome to participate.

One of the areas of the program that has limited budget allocation is the equipment and space that the team works in. Support from the 100 Women Who Care Organization would enable investment in equipment that would add new team capabilities and be utilized for several years. The most important outcome of this investment would not be the more competitive robots that the team will build, but skills and confidence that the members gain and the ability to secure the sustainability of this program for years to come.

Two identified needs for the team are additive manufacturing(3d printing) and CNC machining. Prusa XL 3d printer \$4300 - enables exposure to additive manufacturing and creates parts from multiple materials. Available to order now.

Shopsabre 23 CNC router: \$11500 - \$16000 - adds machining capabilities to create accurate parts. Quote needed to establish final cost and lead time.

The rest of the grant would be used to make sure required fixtures and materials are available for both robotic machines so that we are sure to have them both available when needed, as this has not always been feasible in the past.

MY RELATIONSHIP/EXPERIENCE WITH THIS ORGANIZATION *

My connection to this organization began when my husband, a retired computer scientist, started volunteering with the team two years ago. Since then, he has had the opportunity to attend several competitions - including last year's state competition—the first time the team had ever advanced to that level. Through this experience, it has become clear that schools with larger communities have access to far more robust resources. A gift from 100 Women would help level the playing field by providing the robotics team with essential core equipment and supplies, enabling them to better compete, grow, and thrive.
