### AUGUST RECIPIENT

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library GTR was selected to receive our collective donation which will be used to provide 160 Antrim County children with one new, age-appropriate book from birth through their 5th birthday, at no cost to the families. The need to foster emergent literacy in the Grand Traverse Region is great: 56% of children are not ready for kindergarten and 52% of children are not reading at grade level by the end of third grade.

## \$23,200 DONATION

According to Books from Birth director Bob Robbins, "Birth to age 5 is the most critical period for brain development and reading aloud to a child is the single most important activity a parent can do to prepare their child for kindergarten. Due to a lack of funding, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library was not previously available to Antrim county children. Thanks to this generous gift from 100 Women Who Care - Elk Rapids Area, it will be available starting later this year."
